What is the AMEP?

The Adult Migrant English Program offers **FREE** English classes for migrants and refugees living in Australia.

Learning English can help you...

- get a job
- start other training
- meet new friends
- help your children with their school work
- talk to other people in your neighbourhood.

Am I eligible?

You may be eligible to enrol in AMEP classes if you are a migrant or refugee with a permanent visa.

You may also be eligible to join the program if you are:

- a migrant with an eligible temporary visa
- an Australian citizen who previously held a permanent visa
- a young person (15 to 17 years)
(Youth programs available).

How do I enrol?

You will need to book in for an appointment. To find your closest centre, go to the Melbourne AMEP website www.melbourneamep.com.au or call **1300 062 314**.

Please bring your passport/travel documents and visa with you to your appointment.

During your appointment, we will:

- assess your current level of English
- develop a plan for your study and career goals
- discuss your childcare needs (if applicable)
- inform you of the next course starting date
- agree on the number of hours you will study each week and the type of class you will attend.

You may bring a friend or family member to the appointment.

If you have children who are not yet at school, the AMEP also provides free childcare services while you are attending AMEP classes.

Learning options

You can choose to study:

- full-time
- part-time
- day or evening.

You can get extra English...

- through one-on-one support with a *Volunteer Tutor* online or face-to-face in a public space like a library
- through *Distance Learning*.

During your course, you will take part in lots of activities to help you to settle successfully in Australia.

What other study can I do?

The **Workplace English** program offers additional English to prepare you for work in Australia and work placement experience.

Many Melbourne AMEP centres offer English electives linked to specific work and vocational studies.

Melbourne AMEP centres also provide a range of other English programs if you are not eligible for the AMEP.

Contact your nearest Melbourne AMEP centre to find the English class best for you.
